

# TV Key Previews

Today's top television shows are previewed and selected for the Journal by TV Key's staff of experts who attend rehearsals, watch screenings and analyze scripts in New York and Hollywood.

**INTERNATIONAL SHOW TIME.** "Circus Williams." (Repeat) The outstanding performances here come from the animal acts. Toward the latter part of the

show, you get a chance to see a troupe of beautifully trained elephants and, in between, there's the usual spectacle of aerial prowess and horsemanship. (8:30 p.m., Channel 4.)

**"BREAKTHROUGH: Cancer Virus."** More than anything else, this documentary bolsters your hope and faith in the dedicated perseverance of doctors in research. Throughout the hour, physicians all over the world report through interviews with Dr. John R. Heller, president of New York's Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center, on their experiments on viruses that can cause cancer, and their search for a vaccine to eliminate their spread. The early interviews may seem a bit stilted, but stay with the show. (7:30 p.m., Channel 4.)

**TWILIGHT ZONE.** "The Odyssey of Flight 33." (Repeat.) A good subject involving the puzzle of the time barrier gets a different treatment here. The story itself deals with a jetliner that goes through both the sound and time barriers. (8:00 p.m., Channel 13.)

**EYEWITNESS.** All things

being equal on the news front, tonight's report covers the highlights of today's Democratic state convention in Springfield, Mass. As a matter of record, both Edward (Ted) Kennedy and Edward McCormack have said they will run in the forthcoming primary, regardless of the decision of the convention. (8:30 p.m., Channel 13.)

**CHET HUNTLEY REPORTING.** An on-the-spot report on a pivotal Latin American country, Guatemala, and its president's attempts to prevent the Communists from returning to power. (8:00 p.m., Channel 4.)

**THE DETECTIVES.** "Shadow of His Brother." (Repeat) At least when this show does stock stories, it does them well. In this one, Captain Holbrook is kidnapped by the brother of a man scheduled to be executed that night. Object: To kill the captain at the precise moment the convicted killer gets his. (9 p.m., Channel 4.)

## Kennedy Plans Tax-Slash Call

economy were operating at full blast there would be tax revenues to provide an \$8 billion surplus. The administration is expecting a deficit next year.

The President was asked whether he still favored passage of legislation for withholding of income tax on dividends and interest and a stiffer taxation of earnings by American firms overseas.

He said he hoped both measures would pass and said the withholding proposal was not a new tax but a more effective way of collecting an existing one.

The other measure dealing with U.S. firms overseas is designed to make it less attractive for American investments abroad as a check on the flow of gold and dollars out of the country, he said.
